

Bridging Ideas for Girl Scout Daisies, Brownies, and Juniors

Bridging Step One: Pass It On!

Share your talents and skills by teaching younger Girl Scouts something you learned in your current Girl Scout Level.

Ideas include:

- Make a scrapbook of all of the fun things you did in Girl Scouts this year. Share it with family, friends, or younger Girl Scouts.
- Create a skit that shares how your troop made the world a better place. Share your skit with others.
- Teach younger Girl Scouts a song, game, or craft that you loved to do in Girl Scouts.
- Make a troop mural of the awards/badges/petals you earned and what you learned this year. Share it with another troop or display it at your service unit's court of awards ceremony.

Bridging Step Two: Look Ahead!

Find out what the next level of Girl Scouting has in store.

Ideas include:

- Attend an Intro Event.
- Review the Journey books and Girls Guide for your next level of Girl Scouting.
 Make a list of badges and awards you look forward to trying.
- Meet with older Girl Scouts and find out what their favorite part of the Girl Scout law is and why. Play a game or sing a song together!
- Do an activity from a Journey or badge for the next program grade level.
- Learn about the Bronze or Silver Award (for upcoming Juniors and Cadettes) from girls who have earned the award. Or review the requirements for each award and share what you hope to learn by earning them.
