

MY PROMISE, MY FAITH ACTIVITY PLAN 2

Award Purpose: Girls earn this award through exploring how Girl Scouting and their faith offer similar ideas.

Activity Plan Length: 1.5 hours

Getting Started

Time: 15 minutes

Materials Needed: (Optional) Girl Scout Promise and Law poster

Welcome everyone to the meeting, recite the Girl Scout Promise and Law.

Activity #1: Interview Review

Time: 20 minutes

Award Connection: Step 2 – Find a woman in our own or another faith community

Materials Needed: Responses to the interview questions

Prep Needed:

- Remind girls and families to complete the interview with a woman of faith and to bring the responses to the meeting.
- Ask the girls to share who they interviewed after the last meeting. They should share 2-3 things from their interview that they found interesting.
 - Once everyone has shared, ask the girls what was something from their interview that surprised them.



Activity #2: Let's Create!

Time: 35 minutes

Award Connection: Step 4 – Make something to remind you of what you've learned

Materials Needed: Paper, writing utensils, and art supplies

1. Explain to the girls that they are going to create a skit, song, piece of art, or poem about how they connect the Girl Scout Law and their faith. They can use what they learned from their women of faith interviews and quote murals to help brainstorm ideas.
2. Have girls work in small groups. Each group will work together on their skit, song, piece of art, or poem that they will share with each other and their families. Give groups about 20 minutes to work on their skit, song, piece of art, or poem.
3. Come back together as a troop and ask the girls to quickly plan a “show” where they will perform or reveal their creations for family and friends. Ask the girls to work together to plan their show. Here are a few things for girls to discuss:
 - How will you present each performance?
 - Who will go first?
 - How will you get the audience's attention?
 - How will you wrap up the show?

Activity #3: Share with Family and Friends

Time: 15 minutes

Award Connection: Step 5 – Make a commitment to live what you've learned

Materials Needed: Project from the activity before

Prep Needed:

- Invite families to attend the end of your troop meeting.
 - Prepare a stage and audience area.
 - Set up chairs for family members.
1. Have the girls welcome family members to their meeting and show them to their seats.
 2. Introduce the activity to families and share what the girls have worked on.
 3. Ask the girls to start the show!

Wrapping Up

Time: 15 minutes

Materials Needed: Make New Friends lyrics (optional)

Close the meeting by singing Make New Friends and doing a friendship circle.

More to Explore

- Field Trip Ideas:
 - Attend a high school play and talk about the performance.
 - Visit a library and research poems and songs related to your faith.
- Speaker Ideas:
 - Invite a someone from your faith community to share poems and songs with the girls.
 - Invite a theater major to help girls put together their “show”.
